All Fellows have demonstrated a commitment to creating a more just, inclusive and sustainable society through their work, and are:

- Building solutions based on a deep understanding of the issue
- Making a long-term play to change the system they are working in
- Influencing change in their current work, formally or informally
- Ready to undergo an intensive year-long leadership journey

## OVERVIEW OF THE WEST AFRICA FELLOWS PROGRAMME

Fellows will explore how they can approach personal, organisational and societal challenges differently as they build the tools and mindset to:

- Lead diverse stakeholders through recurring and complex challenges
- Develop stories that speak across lines of difference & move others to action
- Understand systemic problems and design more effective interventions
- Navigate uncertainty and embrace the meaningful process of change
- Cultivate a deeper understanding of yourself and your work

Fellows will be applying the concepts we learn within the cohort, as they seek to model the change they want to see in the world. The Fellowship curriculum draws on powerful leadership frameworks, tools and approaches, including:

- Adaptive Leadership grounded in Ron Heifetz's work
- Authentic Voice grounded in Marshall Ganz's life's work
- Good Society Readings modelled off The Aspen Institute
- Managing Polarities based on Barry Johnson's work

# FELLOWS ARE TYPICALLY ON ONE OF THE FOLLOWING PATHS

#### **Social Entrepreneur**

Founder of a for-profit or non-profit organization that develop marketbased solutions to tackle issues of poverty & injustice.

#### **Organizational Builder**

Supporting the growth of institutions from within (eg. Country Director, CEO, COO)

#### Intrapreneur

Creating solutions from within existing institutions (eg. Team lead, Head of Dept)

## WHAT TO EXPECT FROM THE FELLOWSHIP

The Fellowship begins with a year-long leadership programme - where practical skills meet moral imagination. After the first year, Fellows become part of Acumen's global community of social innovators - committed to lifelong learning, collaboration and accompaniment as they build a world based on dignity.

#### The Fellows Programme is centred around:

- Self-reflection: Fellows have space to broaden their perspectives and identify areas of personal development
- Cohort based learning: Fellows have space to practice new modes of leadership with a diverse group of builders from across sectors and backgrounds
- Real-world application: Fellows take away learning that can be immediately applied to their social change work to generate lasting impact

### THE PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The Fellowship is a deep commitment and serious investment from Fellows and the Acumen Academy team. Over the course of a year, Fellows will engage in a series of virtual workshops and immersive held across West Africa.

We will want to learn more about the track record and vision of the initiative or organisation you are building.

#### The Fellowship is designed to navigate challenges that have no easy answers

We will want to learn more about the challenges you are facing, who you need to mobilise, and what you need to do differently in order to take your impact to the next level.

#### The Fellowship is designed for those who are able to commit to the journey

All Fellows have significant obligations – professional and personal. We will want to learn more about your motivation for applying and how you will make it a priority over the year.

#### The Fellowship is designed to stretch limits & challenge assumptions

It will require work from everyone to build a brave and trusted space, and the programme invites deep introspection on the patterns of our own behaviour. We will want to learn more about why you feel now is the right time for you to go through the Fellowship and stretch your limits.



## A COMMUNITY OF GLOBAL INNOVATORS

After the programme, the Fellows become part of a community of moral leaders who are fighting poverty or injustice in their region and across the world.



### **AISHATU JAHUN**

Aishatu is the Executive Director and Founder of Baba Azimi Foundation (BAF); an organization providing effective protection services for women, children, and persons with disabilities. Aishatu is a 2022 Acumen Fellow



### **TERESA NJOROGE**

is bridging the gap between incarceration and social reintegration in Kenya. Her experience of being convicted of a crime she didn't commit led her to launch Clean Start, and she became an East Africa Fellow in 2016 to deepen her capacity to lead change.



### **VIMAL KUMAR**

was born into India's lowest caste, sometimes referred to as "The Untouchables". He became an Acumen Fellow in 2015, and is mobilising a movement to bring basic human rights to his community as founder of Movement for Scavenger Community.



### **SHAMIM AKHTAR**

is the eldest of eight children, born in a rural village in the Sindh province of Pakistan. Shamim became a Fellow in 2015 and works with Thardeep Rural Development Program to empower women across rural communities to secure their rights.
